- Wednesday, 5:00 to 7:00 PM

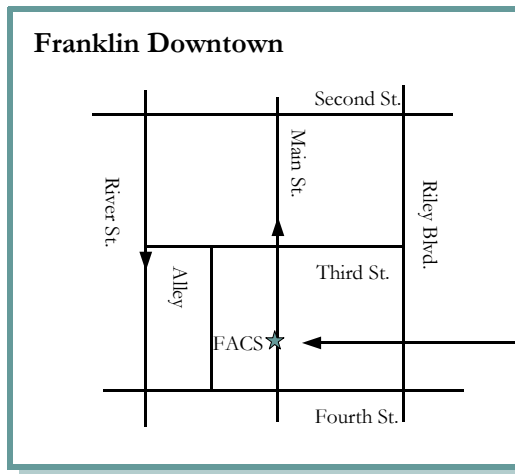

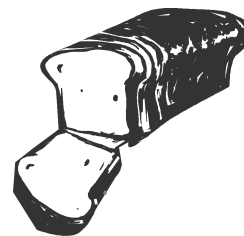

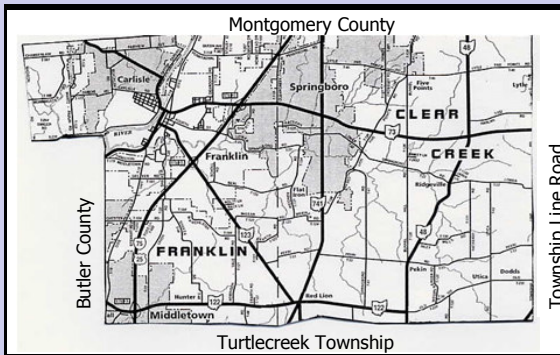

# All About FACS

- FACS is a non-profit (501c3) organization.
- We have been helping our community since 1979.
- We have a board of directors and over 85 individual volunteers and organizations who run the pantry under our Director's guidance.
- We are a United Way funded organization.
- We serve a population of 48,768 people living in the Franklin and Clearcreek Townships which include Franklin, Springboro, Carlisle and Chautauqua.

  - Served 1,587 families.

# Services We Provide

## Food Assistance

Families may visit our food pantry once per month. We provide families with food baskets containing 5 days of groceries.

## Financial Assistance

The agency provides limited, emergency financial aid to qualified clients as funds permit for the following categories:

- Water Shutoff Notice
- Landlord Eviction Notice
- Prescriptions
- Gas Vouchers
